Our Autumn term began with a topic based on Traditional Tales. We read and retold many stories and the topic provided us with inspiration for creative writing, artwork and roleplay. The Spring term, although short, was a busy one. All our class now came to school full time and we began to learn about Giants. Our class trip was to Truro Museum for an exciting workshop with Marvin the Mouse. Indian Queens Bands came and gave a great performance to the children and allowed them to play their instruments. The second topic of the term was 'Song and Dance' and the children listened to and performed to a wide range of music. We explored the village and the local landmarks and came back to school and made a huge map of the village. We raised money for Bongwe school in Kenya with our Harambee day. We came to school dressed in colours from the Kenyan flag and took part in a range of special activities to learn more about children from Kenya.

The Summer term began with a focus on 'Foods of the World'. The reception children have visited Forest school in small groups had a wonderful time learning at the farm and in the forest. We were very lucky to have a visit from two teachers that work at Bongwe School in Kenya. They spent the day with us and shared with the children information about their school and the children they teach.
