Although in school we teach the children about internet safety, we cannot monitor what sites they are using at home, so please be aware of and monitor your child's use of technology.

# Crisp packet recycling scheme

From Monday we will be participating in the crisp packet recycling scheme organised by Walker's crisps and TerraCycle. Children will be encouraged at lunch time to put their used crisp packets in a separate box and these will be sent for recycling where they will be made into plastic pellets that can then be used to make recycled items such as benches and pots. ### **School Uniform**

A reminder that school uniform consists of: grey/black trousers or skirts, royal blue pullover or cardigan, white shirts/polo shirts. Blue/white checked dresses (summer term). **All** footwear should be black in colour and well fitting (shoes not trainers). Heavy boots, high heels, flimsy sandals etc., are not allowed.

**PE:** Children need a pair of black shorts, a plain white T shirt and black plimsolls/trainers. Track suit bottoms are permitted during the winter months only (but in addition to not instead of shorts).

**Jewellery:** The only items of jewellery permitted are two gold or silver ear studs (plain and small). No face jewellery is permitted. An inexpensive watch may also be worn as long as the wearer can tell the time.
