# <u>DfE School Census Day Harvest Lunch-</u> <u>Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October</u>

The DfE School Census takes place on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2019, with a delicious lunch consisting of a pasty (steak or cheese and onion), ice cream or a cake.

Schools are funded by the government for Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) and the number of pupils which receive a meal on this day.

It is imperative to the school budget that as many pupils as possible in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 order a school meal on this day so that the school receives this funding for meals for the forthcoming year.

All pupils in **Reception, Year 1 and Year 2** will be ordered a meal for Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October, regardless of whether they bring in a packed lunch. This will ensure that the school receives the maximum funding for UIFSM.
