To the Parents/Guardians of Children in Year 5,



As part of our learning about animals and their life cycles, we are pleased to inform you that the Year 5 children will be visiting Ennis Barton Farm on **Friday 12th July**. During the trip, the children will be taking part in a number of activities to gain an understanding of animals, their life cycles and life in the country.

Children will leave school shortly after 9:30am and will return to school by 2:30pm. We will travel by bus, and children should come to school dressed in clothes suitable for the farm (old clothes). They will also need to bring wellington boots or sensible shoes (that they do not mind getting muddy) and a waterproof coat. Children will need to bring a packed lunch. Those in receipt of free school meals, will have a packed lunch provided for them by the school kitchen.

A voluntary contribution of £3.00 per child to help with the costs of this visit would be very much appreciated. Should sufficient contributions not be forthcoming we regret that the visit may not be able to place.

NOTES
