Number – Number and Place Value

Count from 0 in multiples of 4,8,50 and 100; find 10 or 100 more/less than a number.

Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number.

Compare and order numbers up to 1000.

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations.

Read and write numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words.

Solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas.

Music

Listen and appraise the song Let Your Spirit Fly and other songs.

Learn and/or build on knowledge about the interrelated dimensions of music.

Perform and share their learning throughout the unit of work.

Locate main countries in Europe and their cities.
