It was a great evening and it was great to see so many families come to support us. We are delighted to announce that we raised an incredible £827.34 which will continue to support the funding of events, activities and resources for the children. Thank you so much to Mr Edie and the other members of the band 'Gerry and the Hat-tricks' for entertaining people so brilliantly during the evening.

Also a huge well done to Year 6 who managed to raise a further £450.00 from their interesting and enterprising 'Fiver Challenge' stalls. This money will be used to fund their end of term beach visit (and ice cream treats). The children have also decided to donate £250 of this money to Shelterbox following a visit to their visitor centre earlier this year.

Educational Visits

The Year 6 children have been passionate about environmental issues. especially with so much about plastic in the news, and they had a great opportunity to visit the Cornwall Energy Recovery Centre to find out how un-recyclable waste is being converted into energy rather than just buried in landfill. The children watched the giant claws lift waste and toured the control room, as well as explored the interactive displays. It was an informative and inspiring visit.

Today, Year 2 visited Ennis Barton Farm to learn about dairy farming. We had the chance to use a milking machine, try out milking by hand (on a model cow) and saw some of the 900 cows that live on the farm. All the children had a great time and learned lots.

We would like to say a big thank you to the staff who gave up their time to take them to camp, it is much appreciated. Year 5 are looking forward to their camp next week.
