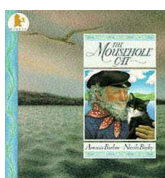

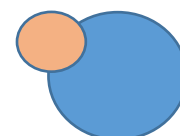

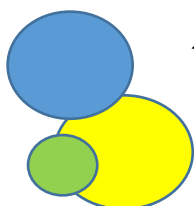
## CHILDREN IN NEED

*A huge thank you to everyone who supported our Children in Need events this week.*

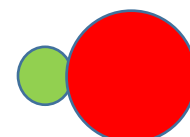


*Thanks so much to everyone who supplied cakes and items for the Bring and Buy sale, we were completely overwhelmed with the response.*
