Plastic Free Day – 8th May

To celebrate the birthday of Sir David Attenborough, we are joining many other schools to take part in the '8th May Plastic-Free Day'. You will have seen coverage of the dreadful levels of plastic pollution in our oceans, which is harming wildlife and even getting into our own food chain.

We are asking children who have a packed lunch to come in with no single-use plastic in their lunch box – so no disposable bottles etc. Sandwiches and other contents could be wrapped in tin foil or come in a container (plastic such as Tupperware is reusable, so is OK!) and please make sure your child has a reusable water bottle with them. Some Year 6 children will also be presenting their own assembly.

We hope that taking part in this day will help our children to learn about how we can reduce the amount of plastic pollution endangering our wildlife and environment, and to be extra vigilant about littering and choosing to avoid single-use plastic wherever possible. Thank you for your support!
