Nursery meals are also bookable via ParentPay. Please remember to select the 'Nursery' drop down when booking. The cost of a nursery meal this year has increased to £2.10.

I wanted to introduce myself and the PINS project so you know what to expect.

The Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) is a new project that builds on the idea of using a community approach to improve the experiences and inclusion of neurodivergent children within mainstream school settings.

The community engagement opportunities will be informal and inclusive sessions, where parent carer views and experiences will be gathered. Parent carers will also have the opportunity to explore ideas that could create positive change within their school community, together with school staff.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Your child's annual nasal flu vaccination is now due

Kernow Health CIC's School Age Immunisation Service will be delivering the annual nasal flu vaccination programme in schools across Cornwall and Devon on behalf of NHS England.

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and may lead to serious complications. Vaccinating your child not only protects them but also helps prevent the spread of flu to more vulnerable friends and family members. The flu vaccine is a quick, painless spray administered into each nostril and is known as LAIV (Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine.)

Who Is Eligible?

For the 2025/26 season, all children from Reception to Year 11 will be offered the free nasal flu vaccine.

Important Reminders

- You must opt in for your child to receive the vaccine. Without a submitted consent form, your child will not be vaccinated.
- If your child becomes wheezy or their asthma medication is increased after submitting the form, please contact us immediately.
- If you choose not to vaccinate your child, we kindly ask that you still complete the form and
 provide your reason. This helps us improve the service.
- If you have submitted a yes consent but have since changed your mind, please call
 us on one of the numbers above so that we can change the consent
- If you need this information in a different format or require communication support, please let us know.
- Your child may be able to self-consent to receive the vaccine if they are considered competent to do so. This is called Gillick competence. For more information: NHS Children and young people - consent to treatment

EYFS



Instead, this book encourages little minds to think about the type of person they want to be. A goraeous picture book offering your children the chance to explore different

personality traits and values.



I'm Goina to Make a Friena by Darren Chetty and illustrated by Sandhva Prabhat (Little Tiger Press Group, 2025).

This debut picture book explores the vulnerability and worry of making new friends when moving home or school. The child in this story has so many auestions racing around in his head before realising that diving in is the best way to approach this challenge. Rhythmic and playful text combines beautifully with charming illustrations to make this a perfect read for your new class.



Word Trouble by Vvara Bovadjieva (Walker Books Ltd, 2023)
Ronnie has iust moved to a new country, new home and new school. Everything feels confusina, especially when he can't speak the same lanauaae. The first days are hard but, little by little, friendship and laughter help Ronnie feel more connected. This is a heartwarming story about the first weeks of school for you to enjoy with your class.





Friends of Indian Queens School




Friends of Indian Queens School Annual General Meeting will be held on Thursday 16th October at 3:15pm.

Please always check ingredient lists and allergen warnings when packing your child's food. If you are unsure, it's safer to leave the item out.
