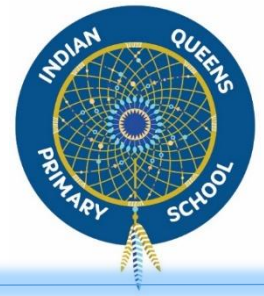

Home school review meetings

Thanks to all parents who have attended meetings, we look forward to the rest of the meetings next week.

Book fair

5th October – 15th October

In the past, our school book fairs have been incredibly popular and have raised an incredible amount of money for our school. However, due to current Covid restrictions, this time we will need to run it differently.

All children will have the opportunity to view the books on Monday (during school time). Parents can view a selection of the books that we have available here [The Book Fair selection - Scholastic Book Fairs](#). (We do not have the 11+ range). KS2 children will then bring home a 'wish list' of book/s they wish to purchase (you can then decide if you agree!!) Parents will then need to pay for books online using this link <https://bookfairs.scholastic.co.uk/pay/1178224>.

Books will then be sent home with the children (unless you inform us that you wish to collect the books from the office as a surprise – please email if this is the case).

The book fair will be open from Tuesday 5th – Friday 15th from 3.15pm – 3.45pm for parents who do wish to see the books, however we will need to strictly limit parental numbers, so ask you to purchase online if possible or stagger the day you visit (parents will be asked to wait outside if we have too many). You do not need to come on the first day to get the book your child wants, if they sell out we can always order more. For the safety of the staff giving up their own time to run the book fair, we ask parents to wear facemasks (unless they are medically exempt).

Covid

Public Health England have asked us to remind parents about the importance of remaining vigilant to the spread of Covid. Please keep encouraging the children to wash their hands, order a PCR test if you are concerned about symptoms (lateral flow tests are not considered accurate in children under 11) and if parents could continue to remember the importance of social distancing and wearing masks at drop off and collection. Thank you.

Transfer to secondary school -September 2022

If your child is in Year 6 you need to apply for a secondary school place by 31st October 2021.

Starting school- September 2022

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018, you need to apply for a place for them to start Reception by 15th January 2022. You must apply, even they already attend the school nursery.
