Music

Learn and perform the song 'Hey You'.

Listen to a range of live and recorded music.

PE

Develop simple team game tactics of attack and defence. Develop balance and coordination through gymnastics.

Science

Identify, name and label parts of the human body and say which body part is associated with each sense.

Name everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock.

Describe the properties of a variety of everyday materials.

Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials according to their properties.

Religious Education

Learn about the Creation story from a Christian and Jewish perspective.

To consider and discuss what has been created in our world and why.

Computing

To use technology safely and respectfully.

To capture, save and retrieve photos from a device.

Art and Design Technology

Develop the use and understanding of colour, pattern, texture, line, shape and form when drawing a self-portrait.

To use drawing to share their ideas, experiences and imagination.

History and Geography

To develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time.

To learn about changes within living memory: with a close study of toys and how they have changed over the years.

PSHCE

'Me and My Relationships'

We will be learning to recognise different feelings and how to respond to the ways in which we, or others, feel.

Mathematics

Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words.

Find one more and one less than a given number.

Represent numbers using objects and pictures

Compare numbers using the language of equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

Read, write and interpret addition calculations.

Number bonds facts within 10.

English

Write lists, labels, captions and a recount for 'The Teddy Bears' Picnic'.

Learn to use actions and pictures to retell 'Owl Babies' from memory and write a simple version of the story.

To select and use interesting vocabulary to describe settings and characters.
