

<p>Personal Social and Emotional Development:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to people’s ideas about the stories they have heard <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand that we all like different things and that we won’t all have the same favourite story • Discuss facial expressions in the stories that we explore • Discuss how characters might be feeling in different parts of stories, how would you feel? 	<p>Communication and Language:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore language used in stories and become aware of the meaning of new words. • Share ideas with others about their favourite characters • Listen attentively and recall key events from a story • Begin to use new vocabulary in our own communication 	<p>Physical Development:</p> <p>Story telling through movement:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tiptoe through the woods, don’t bump into the wolf! • Run as fast as you can from the bears, be careful not to bump into a tree! <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Climb the beanstalk! • Stomp your feet like a giant • Pour and mix some porridge • Build a tower, can you build a house for The Three Little Pigs? 	<p>Literacy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn where a ‘title’ is on a book • Which clues on a front cover tell us what the book might be about? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use pictures to tell a story • Use language to discuss what happened at the beginning, and at the end of a story. • Make meaningful marks • Develop being able to tell your own stories based on stories that you have heard.
