In addition to school content provided, the government's Oak Academy online lessons can be used for remote learning for every year group, covering a wide range of curriculum objectives.

The quantity will be dependent on age/year of your child. Some of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Google Classroom for marking. English tasks may consist of Reading, Writing, Spelling and/or Grammar activities in line with the class timetable. Phonics for EYFS and KS1 to work on the sounds your child will be missing. Topic task(s) following the lessons being covered in class that week. This may be the lesson being taught in school uploaded onto Google Classroom/ Tapestry along with resources / worksheets. If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set on Google Classroom which may make use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons.
My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school for longer than the initially 14 days	 Video Learning/Support – at intervals, the staff will upload a short video where they set the children an activity/challenge to complete. They will also discuss the learning that they have set for the children to complete. 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 SEN support, and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls with you and/or child. They will usually be expected to still complete the learning set on Google Classroom. Arbor Class Text Message/phone call from class teacher weekly Arbor Email: Bullet point list of learning ideas, not requiring any ICT devices.
We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure. If a full Lockdown occurs the class teacher will be contactable between 9am – 3 pm excluding 12 – 1 pm.
